

### Statutory Reception Baseline Assessments (RBA)

#### **Reception Baseline Assessment**

#### Do you have a child starting reception class?

If so, your child will be participating in the reception baseline assessment (RBA) within the first 6 weeks of starting reception.

The purpose of the assessment is to provide the starting point for a new measure that will help parents understand how well schools support their pupils to progress between reception and year 6.

#### What is the RBA?

The RBA is a short, interactive and practical assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school, using materials that most children of your child's age will be familiar with. It became statutory for all schools from September 2021.

#### What does participating in the RBA mean for my child?

The RBA is not about judging or labelling your child or putting them under any pressure. Your child cannot 'pass' or 'fail' the assessment. Its main purpose is to create a starting point to measure the progress schools make with their pupils.

### Statutory Reception Baseline Assessments (RBA)

#### How do I prepare my child for the assessment?

You do not need to do anything to prepare your child for the assessment. Your child is unlikely to even know that they are doing an assessment when they are completing the tasks.

#### What if my child cannot access the assessment?

Your child will answer questions verbally or by pointing at or moving objects. The assessment has been designed to ensure that it is inclusive and accessible to as many children as possible, including those with special educational needs or disability (SEND), or English as an additional language (EAL). The teacher can pause the assessment at any time if your child needs a break. There are also modified materials available for children with visual and hearing impairments.

#### How will the data be used?

The data from the assessment will only be used by the Department for Education when your child has reached the end of year 6, to provide the baseline to measure the progress of your child's year group from reception to year 6. The data from the assessment, including numerical scores, is not shared with you, pupils, teachers, or external bodies, including schools, and there will be no published scores at pupil, school or national level.

### **Lunchtimes in School**



## **Medical Information**

- Staff can only administer medicines which have been prescribed for your child.
- If you do have prescribed medication, you must complete a 'Medication Form'. This indicates the dosage and the frequency the medicine needs to be administered. These are available from the school office.
- Please advise us of any medical information and allergies relating to your child on the school admission form.

## **Starting school**

We know that starting school is a really big step. We support every child in our care to thrive in our school and our community and develop a lifelong love of learning.

With this is mind we phase entry, across the first week, into Reception. This enables your child to be part of a smaller group when they are meeting new teachers, talking to new friends and becoming familiar with their classroom, the school and routines. It also gives Reception staff the opportunity to work with your child, to talk to them as they choose activities and to build relationships.

As a result, our children at Appletree settle into Reception quickly and happily, ready for the adventures ahead!

## 2 Days - Part Time

### Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> & Thursday 8th September 2022

All Reception children will start school on Wednesday 7th September for **either** a morning or afternoon session.

### Morning session: 8:45 - 11:30

If your child currently attends morning Nursery they will attend the morning session in Reception.

### Afternoon session 12:30 - 3:20

If your child currently attends afternoon Nursery they will attend the afternoon session in Reception.

If your child attended our Nursery for 30 hours or does not attend AGFS Nursery, you will have confirmation in your welcome pack of which session to attend.

School will be operate extended Wraparound care for Reception children during these days. Please contact our Out of School Club manager, Susanne, for more details.




## **Full Days in Reception**

#### Homework:


 At the beginning of each term we will send out a new Home/School Links letter which will outline upcoming events and provide small weekly tasks and activities to complete at home with your child. Homework will be sent out on a Friday and needs to be returned by Wednesday.

#### PE and Forest School: Every Wednesday

• Children to come in full PE kit which is also suitable for playing in the forest however wearing layers is strongly advised, depending on the weather conditions. We provide full sets of waterproofs.



## **School Uniform**


